





TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR ENLISTMENT TO
M/s Compassion for Orphans (CFO), Waikanae, New Zealand

- This Certificate is non-transferable and subject to immediate return to Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) in the event of closure of the Agency or of its inter-country adoption programme.
- The Agency must have a valid Certificate of License / Recognition as a Child / Adoption Agency from the competent authorities of the provinces where it will place children in adoption. It will be incumbent upon the Agency to renew these licenses before their expiry and to furnish a copy of the same to CARA on its own without expecting any reminder.
- It will have a valid authorization from the Central Authority of its host country (applicable to a Hague Convention country only).
- It will furnish the progress/follow up reports and adoption decrees regularly for the children adopted through it as required under para 6.6 of the *Guidelines for Adoption from India - 2006*, hereinafter, called 'the Guidelines'.
- It will regularly furnish Annual Reports & Returns highlighting its inter-country adoption from India as required under para 6.2 (iv) of the Guidelines.
- It will immediately withdraw the child if there is an adjustment problem of the child with the family or otherwise and will keep the child in its custody and care under intimation to the concerned Indian Diplomatic Mission, Indian Agency and CARA. It will take appropriate measures for the alternative rehabilitation of the child in consultation with the said concerned Indian Agency / Authorities (as required under para 6.6 (c) of the Guidelines).
- It will organize get-to-gathers of adopted children of Indian origin and their adoptive families under intimation / invitation to the concerned Indian Diplomatic Mission (as required under para 6.7 of the Guidelines).
- It will not encourage any prospective adoptive parents to establish contact with Indian Agency or with an Indian child before they are determined as eligible and suitable to adopt and unless the child is declared legally free for inter-country adoption by competent authorities in India.
- It must have professionally competent staff handling Inter-country adoption programme, an updated list of which may be furnished to CARA alongwith its Annual Report every year.
- It will pursue only non-profit and non-commercial objectives and will not make any improper financial or other gain out of any adoption. It will charge only those fees from adoptive parents which might be permitted under the Law of India as well as of its host country/ provinces.
- It will scrupulously follow other relevant provisions of the Guidelines for Adoption from India - 2006.
- It will abide by directions issued by CARA from time to time in connection with its inter-country adoption programme from India
- The enlistment will remain valid for the period from **13.03.2008 to 12.03.2013** unless suspended, revoked or withdrawn, after giving opportunity to the Agency to explain its position, due to any malpractice, violation of the said Guidelines, non-compliance to the above mentioned Terms & Conditions or due to any change in the policy of Govt. of India governing the subject matter.
